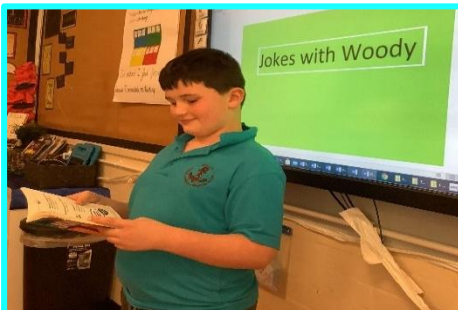
Dear Parents and Carers,

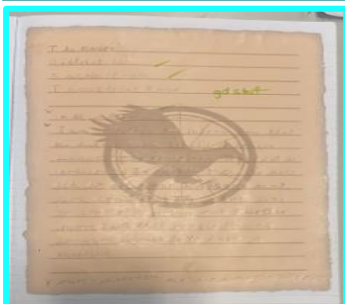

In Henson class, children have started writing a persuasive letter linked to their core text in English. They enjoyed collaborating to produce convincing arguments for stopping The Hunger Games.

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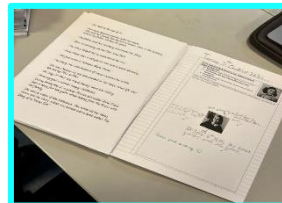


Monday 11th October – PTA Pumpkin Patch and Spooktacular Sweet Sale

Explorers class have been on a walk around their local area. We discussed who is in our local community and what their roles are. We also used our senses and explored how nature is changing during Autumn. We found different coloured leaves and conkers to add to our loose parts.



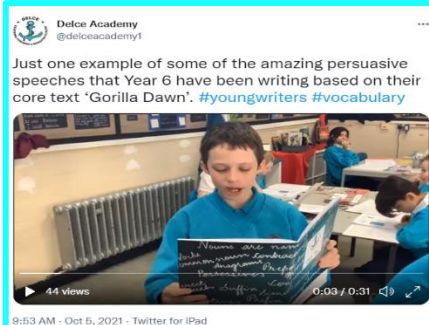
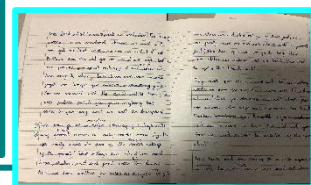
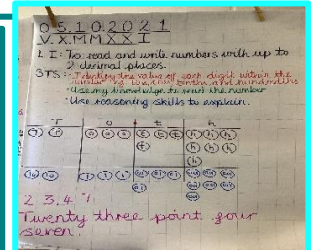
Inventors have been investigating number bonds to 9 this week. The children have been using different concrete and abstract resources to rehearse and embed their knowledge.



Year 5 have learnt how to read and write numbers with up to three decimal places. We have been able to make a range of decimal numbers using place value counters and represent them in a range of ways in our books. Year 5 can now compare and order numbers with up to three decimal places and explain their reasoning using Mathematical vocabulary.

In Year 4, the children explored the historical figure of Anne Frank and applied their knowledge of research to identify and find facts about her. They accumulated their ideas and research onto one bank of facts to use in their letter writing next week!

Year 3 have had an amazing Science lesson this week. They have enjoyed looking at how a fossil is formed within their science lessons. They became palaeontologist's and created their own fossils to help with their understanding of how they are formed. Looks like they had great fun!



Year 6 have been creating some amazing persuasive speeches this week in English based around our core text 'Gorilla Dawn'. The children used their knowledge of the characters and features of persuasive texts to write a motivational speech from the perspective of The Black Mamba. The children really enjoyed getting into character and reading their speeches with intonation and enthusiasm.

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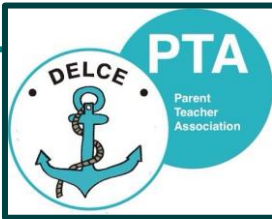
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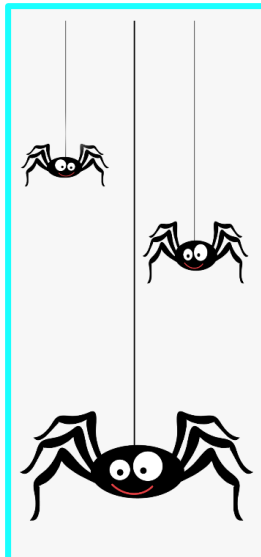
