

Pupil Premium funding.

The funding was allocated to schools on the basis of pupils eligible for Free School Meals.

In 2011/12 the school received £29,240 in Pupil Premium funding which contributed to the following initiatives;

Initiative	Cost	Impact
Graduate Teaching Programme x 2	£32,000	Work with identified small groups of children supporting their learning, boosting their self-esteem and raising standards. Running after school booster and thinking skills clubs.
One-2-One Tuition	£6,000	Targeted, specific support for individual children to ensure positive improvements in their learning.
Emotional support	Art Therapy - £7,000 Counselling - £4,800	Supporting children through personal growth and change in their lives enabling access to learning and emotional development.
Subsidising costs of school trips.	£2,000	To enhance the curriculum and ensure all children are able to participate and have the opportunity to experience new and challenging activities

In 2012/13 the school will receive £69,000 in Pupil Premium Funding.
